Step 6: Position fabric #3 right side up under section B-3 on the backside of the paper. Match the edge of fabric #3 along the trimmed quarter inch seam allowance on fabric #2. Open the foundation paper and sew on line 2. Continue sewing the rest of the fabrics to the foundation paper. Remember, tear stitches loose, fold on line, and trim the quarter inch seam with your add-aquarter ruler before sewing on the next piece.

Step 7: When all the pieces are sewn on, press fabric #11 and trim the border units on the outside cutting line as shown below. Do not remove the paper at this time.



Complete all of the units before moving onto the corners.

Cutting Instructions for Corner Units

Foundation Paper:

76" X 79" Cu 76" X 90" Cu 91 X 103" Cu 106" X 115" Cu

Cut 16 each A & B units Cut 16 each A & B units Cut 20 each A & B units Cut 24 each A & B units





Templates: Templates CB-2, CB-4, and CB-6 are used for the background fabric. Templates CB-1, CB-3, CB-5, CB-7 and CB-8 are used for the dark fabric. Place each of the templates with the designated fabric before cutting.

Cutting: Cut two strips of fabric for each of the border templates. The size of each strip is written in the following information and also on each of the templates. Fold the strips wrong sides together. Use the templates and cut the following number of pieces required for your quilt. Some of your strips will not produce the number of pieces required. When this happens, utilize the leftover fabric from another strip.

Template CB-1: Fold fabric wrong sides together. Cut two strips 5 1/2" by 42" from one of the selected dark fabrics.



Each strip yields 16 pieces.

Note: For the queen and king size quilt you will need to cut four strips for Template CB-1. After cutting the correct number of CB-1 pieces from your two strips use the left over fabric to cut pieces from template CB-3.

Template CB-3: Fold fabric wrong sides together. Cut two strips 5" by 42" from one of the selected dark fabrics.



Template CB-5: Fold fabric wrong sides together. Cut two strips 4 1/4" by 42" from one of the selected dark fabrics.



Template CB-7: Fold fabric wrong sides together. Cut two strips 3 1/4" by 42" from one of the selected dark fabrics.



Each strip yields 24 pieces

Template CB-8: Fold fabric wrong sides together. Cut two strips 5 1/2" by 42" from one of the selected dark fabrics.



Template CB-2: Fold fabric wrong sides together. Cut two strips 5 1/4" by 42" from your light background fabric.



Each strip yields 28 pieces

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Template CB-4: Fold fabric wrong sides together. Cut two strips 4 1/2" by 42" from your light background fabric.



Each strip yields 24 pieces

Template CB-6: Fold fabric wrong sides together. Cut two strips 3 1/2" by 42" from your light background fabric.



Each strip yields 24 pieces

Foundation Piecing Corner Units

The corner units are sewn together with the same technique as the border pieces. I have included the graphics to get you started on these units. Notice the location of the first piece (CB-1).



Glue the fabric cut from the template CB-1 onto the wrong side of the paper under section CB-1.



Fold on line 1. Trim a quarter inch seam allowance. Place fabric #2 cut from template CB-2 under fabric #1. Sew on line 1. Continue sewing each of the pieces onto the foundation paper that were cut with your corner template.

NOTE: Ignore the line on the foundation paper that reads optional star. That piece is only added when using these papers for another pattern. CB-8 is the last piece you sew on. It is added by sewing on line 7.

Setting the Units Together

Pull the foundation paper off each of the border units under section BB-3 and B-10. Leave the rest of the paper on behind the spikes. This will stop your pieces from stretching when sewing the lattice strips between the borders. This will also make it easier to match all the quarter inch lines and points.

Lay out all the pieced units into rows to make sure the

stars and borders are positioned properly as shown on the quilt layout found on page 9.

Note: Layouts for the Queen and King are included in the extra foundation packages which are sold separately.

Sew the stars onto the two border units and press the back side as shown on Pressing Diagram 1 below.



Sew each of the A and B border units together and press the wrong side as shown on Pressing Diagram 1 below.



Pressing Diagram 1

Sew each of the A and B corner units together and press counterclockwise on the wrong side of the fabric.



Sew one star onto each corner unit. Press half of the seams toward the spikes and the other half toward the stars.



Sabertooth Stars

This pattern includes enough foundation paper to complete a quilt 76" by 90" which is 4 rows across and 6 stars long. The quilt on the cover sheet is 4 rows across and 5 stars long and is 76" by 79". The layout for the larger quilt is printed on the center template page.

Dividing up the total yardage amounts into a variety of fabrics of similar value adds texture and dimension to your quilt. The yardage for this quilt was figured with this in mind. If you come up short when cutting, simply add another fabric.
