Dark Spike Fabrics #17: Cut six (6) 6-1/2" by 42" strips from fabric color #17. Place four (4) strips into Bag #3. The other two (2) strips are cut in the following steps.

You should have twenty-six (26) strips now, all cut from the thirteen dark spike fabric 1-17.

Step 1: Cut two (2) 6-1/2" by 11-3/4" rectangles from each strip, for a total of fifty-two (52) pieces. Place these pieces into Bag #1.



Cutting Instructions: Fabric Color #18:

Center Background Template: Cut thirty-two (32) 3-3/4" by <u>3-3/4" squares. Place these pieces into Bag #7.</u>

Cutting Instructions: Unit TW-A: Bag #1



Unit TW-A Background Fabric, **Template Layout Sheet**

1: You should have fifty-two (52) 5-3/4" by 13" background pieces in Bag #1. Separate these pieces into their own color group, then re-stack all the pieces *right-side-up*.

2: You should have four (4) pieces of color #1, and sixteen (16) pieces each of color #2, color #3, & color #4.

3: Position one (1) copy of the 'Unit TW-A Background, Tem-



plate Layout Sheet' onto the top of each stack.

4: Center the layout sheets onto your fabrics leaving about 1/4" of fabric extending beyond the perimeter of the **Template**

Layout Sheet.

5: Starting with Line 1, slice through the paper and fabric at the same time with your rotary cut-

ter. Continue cutting on each line in numerical order until all the sections are cut apart.

6: Clip the templates and fabric pieces together for each section with a binder clip. Keep the pieces separated by color in a small bag and place them back into Bag #1.

Unit TW-A Spike, Template Layout Sheet

1: You should have fifty-two (52) 6-1/2" by 11-3/4" pieces cut from your dark spike fabrics in Bag #1. Separate these pieces by color, then re-stack the pieces *right-side-up*.

2: You should have four (4) pieces of each color. Stack the pieces listed in each of the four (4) groups together.

Group 1: Color #17. Group 2: Stack colors #5, #6, #7 & #8, together. Group 3: Stack colors #9, #10, #11 & #12, together. Group 4: Stack colors #13, #14, #15 & #16, together.

3: Position one (1) copy of 'Unit TW-A Spike, Template Lay-

out Sheet' onto the top of each stack. Center the layout sheets onto your fabrics leaving about 1/ 4" of fabric extending beyond the perimeter of the Template Layout Sheet.





4: Starting with Line 1, slice through the paper and fabric at the same time, cut on each line in numerical order until all the sections are cut apart.

5: Clip the templates and fabric pieces together for each section with a binder clip. Keep the pieces separated for each group in a small bag and place them back into Bag #1.



Unit TW-S Background,

Template Layout Sheet

1: You should have fifty-two (52) 5-3/4" by 7-3/4" background

pieces in Bag #2. Separate these pieces into their own color group, then re-stack all the pieces *right-side-up*.

2: You should have four (4) pieces of color #1, and sixteen (16) pieces each of color #2, color #3, & color #4.



3: Position and center one (1) copy of 'Unit TW-S Background, Template Layout Sheet' onto the top of each stack.

4: Starting with



Line 1, slice through the paper and fabric, cutting on each line in numerical order until all the sections are cut apart.

5: Keep the pieces separated by color in a small bag. Clip the templates and fabric pieces together for each section with a binder clip and place them back into Bag #2.

Unit TW-S Spikes:

1: You should have (156) 2-1/4" by 6-1/2" pieces cut from your spike fabrics in Bag #2. Separate these pieces by color, then re-stack the pieces right-side-up.



2: You should have twelve (12) pieces of each color. Separate and clip the pieces listed in each of the four (4) groups together, and place them back into Bag #2.

Group #1: Color #17. Group #2: Place colors #5, #6, #7 & #8, together. Group #3: Place colors #9, #10, #11 & #12, together. Group #4: Place colors #13, #14, #15 & #16, together.
