Step 3: Position two *AB Strip Piecing Templates* on top each stack and use them to cut (2) pieces from each strip. Clip the remaining end pieces together and set aside at this time.



Step 4: The SP-Template pieces are re-stacked into the sewing order starting with Fabric S4 on the bottom ending with Fabric S1 on the top. A paper clip should be used to keep each group together. Place these pieces in Bag AB-1 with **(4)** Foundation Sheets AB1. At this point, you can also label your papers if you would like. If you intend to chain piece them all at once, this might be a good idea. Just label them as AB1-1 to AB1-4 (then the next group would be AB2-1 to AB2-4, and so forth). Since you are only working with (4) papers at a time, labeling might not be necessary. It is up to you!



Step 5: Repeat the same cutting instructions for each Foundation Sheet AB2, AB3, and AB4. When you are done cutting, clip the fabrics and papers together and place back into Bag #AB-1. When you are done with the papers in Bag #AB-1, continue with the Foundation Sheets in Bag #AB-2. Graphics are shown on the following page.
