GROUP B5, FLYING GEESE INSTRUCTIONS


Ziploc Storage Bags: You will need (2) bag to complete the organization for these blocks. Label the bag as follows to stay organized while cutting the Foundation Units and Templates. This package includes (24) Foundation Units. However, you will only need (16). We recommend setting (1) NP 881 newsprint aside. You can use the extra blocks later for other projects if you like. See Page 27 for more information.

- Block Group Bag B5: (16) Unit B5 Foundation Papers
- Template Bag: Template and Template Layout Sheets.

Preparing Foundation Papers & Templates:


Cut out **(16)** Unit B5, [NP 881]. The Templates and Template Layout Sheets (TLS) are placed in the Template Bag. After the fabrics have been cut, the individual Sec. Temp's are placed into the assigned bags with their associated foundation papers. See the newsprint graphics that follow for information on how to organize your units and templates into bags. **Refer back to General Information under Foundation Papers and Templates for instructions on how to prepare your foundation papers and templates.*

NOTE - T-Temp C is not used in Riptides. See Page 27 for more information on ways to use the extra blocks in this pattern, however.



► Alternative: Color Layout:

The color layout matches the printed side of the paper, which reflects the backside of the quilt. *Please Note: Fabric #s B5-3:a to B5-3:e have each been assigned to a different geese section.*



► Fabric Information:

The Unit Chart includes yardage, fabric numbers, and a reference to the Fabrics #s assigned to the (TLS's) for Unit B5. Fabric B5-1 is assigned to the melon, Fabric B5-2 is assigned to the (BKG), B5-3 to the geese, and B5-4 to the vein. We have also included Fabric A1 with this group, as A1 is sewn to the center of each goose 4-patch using the Partial Seams Method later in the pattern. The chart includes yardage for each Fabric #, along with the # of strips required.

NOTE - Stacking Strips: Always remember to stack your strips in alphabetical order when working with using multiple color.

NOTE - Reuse your Templates and TLS: Templates and (TLS) are repositioned on the cut strips to achieve the number of cuts required in the cutting Instructions. Please read carefully to ensure the correct # of pieces are stacked beneath each Template before cutting.

GROUP B5: CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Fabric B5-1: T-Temp B1

Step 1: Cut and stack **(2)** 3-1/4" by 42" strips from *Fabric B5-1*. Position the strips facing *right-side up*.

Step 2: *Unit B5, T-Template B1* is used to cut (16) pieces. Reposition the templates as needed to complete the cutting. Clip the pieces together and place into the Block Group Bag B5.



▶ Fabric B5-2: TLS #1

One 3-1/4" by 42" strip yields enough fabric to cut (2) pieces, which makes (2) units, matching the size and shape of (TLS #1).

• Cut (8) strips from Fabric B5-2.

Step 1: The (8) 3-1/4" x 42" strips are stacked facing right-side-up.
