

Step 2: Place (1) *Unit A TLS #2* onto the top of each stack, beginning at the left edge. Only one stack is shown. The rest are done the same. Cut around the TLS, then reposition it, cutting (3) stacks with (4) pieces. Then, cut between the pieces, on the Cut Line to separate Sections 3 and 6.



Step 3: Divide each stack by color. Place the proper fabric into each Bag #A1 to #A12.



Fabric A3, TLS #3

Step 1: You should already have all your strips cut into $2-1/2'' \times 42''$ strips. Stack (2) strips of Fabric A3 from Row 1-1 on top of A2 from Row 1-2. Continue, stacking the strips, for each row, in the same way, facing *right-side-up*. You will need a total of (24) $2-1/2'' \times 42''$ strips.



Step 2: Place (1) *Unit A TLS #3* onto the top of each stack, beginning at the left edge. Only one stack is shown. The rest are done the same. Cut around the TLS, then reposition it, cutting (3) stacks with (4) pieces. Then, cut between the pieces, on the Cut Line to separate Sections 2 and 5.



Step 3: Divide each stack by color. Place the proper fabric into each Bag #A1 to #A12.



UNIT A, BAG #A1, STACKING AND SORTING YOUR FABRICS

Work One Bag at a Time: We recommend, to stay organized, that you work all the way through Bag #1, then Bag #2, and so on, which will prevent you from accidentally mixing up fabrics as you piece your blocks. If you work on one bag at a time, you don't have to label the papers.

Piecing them all at Once: If you want to piece them all at once, this is fine. But, we recommend both labeling your papers #1 to #72, and also putting a fabric swatch on the first paper in each bag to remind you that you should be switching fabrics.

Sew-Sides: The sew-side is the first side of any template piece that is sewn onto the foundation paper. The graphics below have assigned a sew-side to each template piece. Pay attention to the sew-sides shown on the graphics when stacking your fabrics. Recognizing the sew sides will help you with the placement of your pieces as you stack and sew your pieces onto the foundation papers.

Sorting: Before you begin paper piecing, position the template pieces for Unit A with the sew-sides aligned at the top.

Stacking the Templates: The templates pieces for each section on the foundation paper are stacked in descending order starting with the fabric for Sec. 7 on the bottom, ending with the fabric of Sec. 1 on the top. Align the sew sides along the top edge of the stack to help organize and position the template pieces, making it possible to pull each fabric piece off the stack in the order and position in which they are sewn onto the foundation paper.



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
