[Wall or Queen Instructions] Jungle Magnolia Group-E

Checkerboard Magnolia: This booklet

includes the foundation papers and Templates, needed to complete the cutting and piecing for Group E. If you are working on the Wall size, all of the papers are included in this booklet. If you are working on the Queen, you will have an extra page of NP 1013 in your Queen expansion booklet, for a total of (2).

Group E: Units E1 - E6

Overview for the Wall and Queen Version: The only difference between the Wall and Queen version is the number of foundation sheets and number of units you must make to complete the guilt. The wall version requires (4) block groups, while the Queen version requires (8) block groups. The cutting and piecing instructions are written for the Wall version. For the queen version, additional information is included on Page 6 and 7 for vardage and cutting. The piecing and assembly are the same, other than you will make (8) corners instead of (4).

General Block Information: Foundation Units E1 through E6, are designed for foundation strip piecing. In this process multiple fabric strips are sewn vertical onto the reverse side of a foundation sheet. Once all the strips are securely sewn, the foundation sheets are cross-cut into smaller, uniform units using a rotary cutter. These smaller units, known as strip sets, are then sewn together to form a block group.

Newsprint: The newsprint included in your instruction package contains the templates needed for constructing the checkerboard blocks and is shown to the right. ALT T-Templates E-4 & E-5 are also provided for those who prefer a traditional, not-pieced option. For detailed guidance on cutting the Foundation Papers, Templates, and Template Layout Sheets (TLS), refer to the appropriate sections of the Introduction Booklet under "Foundation Papers and Templates."

Once the foundation sheets for Units E1 through E6 are cut out, place them into their assigned bags (see the list below). The Templates and Template Layout Sheets should also be cut out, arranged in numerical order, and stored temporarily in a bag labeled "Group E Templates."

During the cutting process, the templates are paired with their corresponding fabric numbers. After cutting each fabric, place the templates and fabric pieces into their assigned bags along with the foundation papers.

Organization Using Ziploc Bags: To keep your fabrics, templates, and papers organized, prepare four (4) large Ziploc bags. Label the bags as shown in the next column.



- Bag #E1: [Wall (1) ea.] or [Queen (2) ea.], Foundation Sheets E1, E2, and E3 for Units E1, E2, & E3.
- Bag #E2: [Wall (1) ea.] or [Queen (2) ea.], Foundation Sheets E4, E5, and E6 for Units E4, E5, & E6.
- Group E, Template Bag: All, Templates, T-Templates, and ALT Templates.

This organizational system ensures that all materials are easy to access and paired correctly during cutting, piecing, and assembly.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

The **Standard Option** (Fabrics E1 - E7) cutting instructions are list first in this booklet. There is only one color option available for the wall quilt. Note: If you are working with the Queen layout you do have the ability to work with two color options.

The Color Option 1 (Fabrics E1 and E7) instructions are listed second. You must choose one or the other color option if you are making the wall quilt. Note: If you are working with the Queen layout you could use the Standard Option for (4) blocks and Option 1 for the other (4) if you wanted.
