

## RAINBOW CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS WALL QUILT

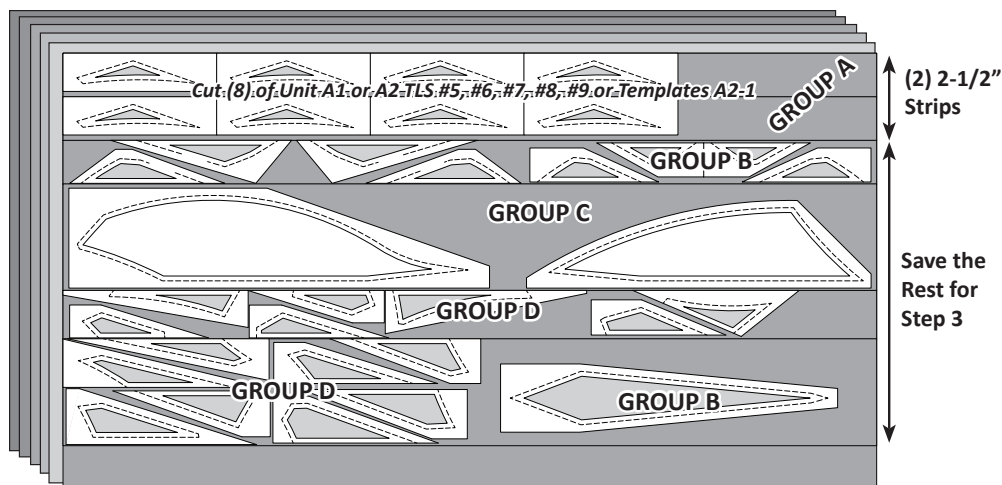
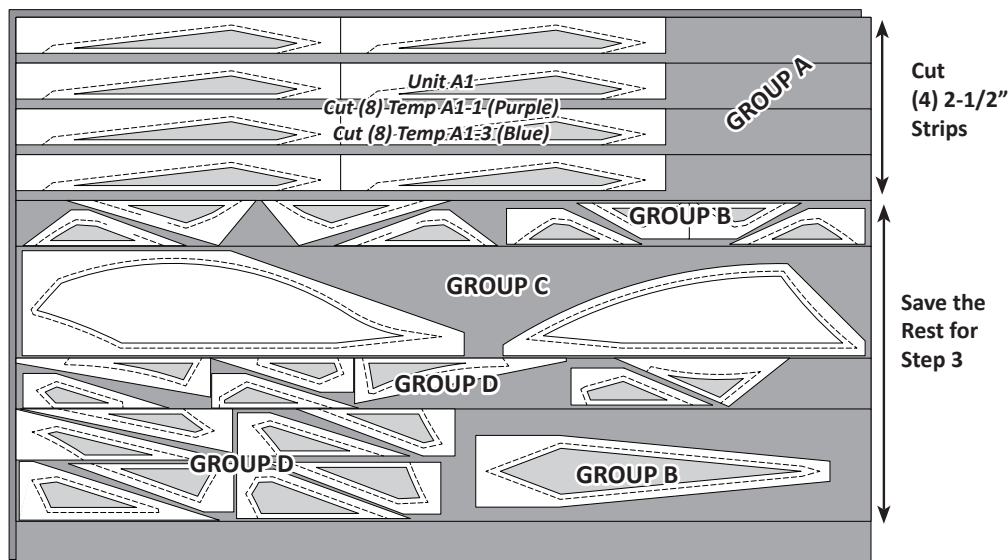
On the Wall Quilt Introduction booklet, there is a rainbow quilt using a pastel rainbow colorway. And, on the Booklet 6 cover, there is a queen quilt that is also a rainbow colorway, this time using a set of brighter rainbow colors, both set against mostly black with white accents. Since we have done kits for all colorways in both wall and queen sizes this year, rainbow cutting instructions are provided here, for both options. To see a picture of the Wall size option you will need to scan the code on the back of the patten and find the Bright Rainbow Wall Kitting Sheet as we simply don't have room to include them all in the pattern.

While there are many ways to make this quilt into a Rainbow layout, you can use the information provided here for two rainbow options. Because each template is only used (1) time on each rainbow fabric color in a rainbow layout, if you use yardage as suggested by Quiltster, you will have a lot of wasted space on the end of each strip. So, we are providing you with alternative cutting where you can share each strip to cut multiple templates, which reduces your yardage significantly. If you want to do a Rainbow quilt, but don't want to do the work to figure out how to reduce your yardage, we suggest using the following cutting approach.

Note that even on the rainbow templates in Quiltster, the yardage will calculate to much more than what we are showing here. We did not load special rainbow templates as we understand many of you will choose a different rainbow arrangement. You can still use this general approach to calculate your own yardage. Get a 3/4 to 1 yard cut of fabric, then arrange your templates on it for each unit you plan to create as a rainbow. You will have to cut some of your TLS sheets apart in some cases. So, don't be afraid to do this to achieve the look you want. Just don't rely on Quiltster to give you a more creative yardage approach. You will need to figure it out yourself. The following graphics are required to cut each of the samples we created.

### ► Pastel Rainbow Wall (Intro Booklet Wall) (6) 5/8 Yard Cuts Red (R2), Orange (R1), Yellow (R8), Green (R7), Teal (R6), Pink (R3), and (2) 3/4 Yard Cuts Blue (R5), Purple(R4)

**Step 1:** From the (2) 3/4 Yard Cuts (Blue and Purple), cut (4) 2-1/2" x 42" strips from the top of the yardage, pair the (4) Purple strips with the **Unit A1, Temp A1-3** templates. Cut (8) pieces the size of the Template. Pair the (4) Blue strips with the **Unit A1-Temp A1-1** template. Cut (8) pieces the size of the Template. Clip the Templates to the respective fabrics, and place into Bag A1.



**Step 2:** From the (6) 5/8 Yard cuts (Orange, Red, Pink, **Yellow**, Teal, Green). Cut (2) 2-1/2" strips from the top of each fabric and pair with the following templates; **Unit A1 TLS #5** (Pink), **TLS #6** (Red), **TLS #7** (Orange), **Unit A2, TLS #8** (Teal), **TLS #9** (Green), and **Template A2-1** (Yellow). Cut (8) of each Template from the (2) corresponding strips. Clip the Templates to the respective fabrics, and place the Unit A1 pieces into Bag A1. Place the Unit A2 pieces into Bag A2.
