
Quilt Assembly Instructions

Quilt Assembly

- **Step 1:** Lay out all the quilt pieces on your design wall, and rearrange if necessary to create a pleasing layout.
- **Step 2:** Join the Large Star/Small Star units into columns. Press columns 1 and 3 down. Press columns 2 and 4 up, as shown in the Illustration 3.
- **Step 3:** Join the columns to form the center of the quilt. Press the long seams from the back, tweaking the intersections of every four seams to create a small 4-patch on the back of the quilt.
- **Step 4:** Assemble the Flying Geese Border as described in the following section "Flying Geese Border Assembly". Lay the borders next to the center of your quilt as shown in Illustration 4.
- **Step 5:** Sew the top and bottom borders on first; then the left and right borders. Press toward the borders.


Your finished quilt top will look like the large line drawing on the following page. Don't forget, all of the illustrations shown in these two pages are now showing your quilt top from the FRONT side!

OPTIONAL FLANGE: To add the optional flange:

- **Step 1:** Cut the flange fabric into **(6)** 1" strips and sew end to end, with the ends cut at a 45 degree angle.
- **Step 2:** Press the flange in half, the entire length of the strip.
- **Step 3:** Measure the horizontal and vertical edges of the quilt and cut the flange into (4) respective strips. Leave enough length on the ends of the cuts to allow for a 1/4" seam allowance.
- **Step 4:** Open the flange up and sew it onto the center of quilt along the pressed line.
- **Step 5:** Step 4: Press the flange so it folds along the seam and the raw edge matches the raw edge of the center of the quilt. Add the borders to the quilt in the following directions.

Flying Geese Border Assembly

The flying geese units are sewn into (4) border strips. The top and bottom borders contain (8) BZ units each. The side borders contain (9) BZ units and (2) CZ units each. The units are sewn end-toend. See the graphics above and to the left for a representation of what the borders should look like. Press the seams all in the same direction for each border set as shown by the arrows. The direction should be the direction that the "geese" are flying.




Yardage Requirements

Background Fabrics (3 Fabrics)

Background #1 (Large Stars) 1-7/8 yd Background #2 (Small Stars) 7/8 yd Background #3 (Small Stars) 7/8 yd

Left Star Points and Border Geese Backgrounds (6 Fabrics)

Color L1 to L5 7/8 yd, each
Color L6 (Left Star 5/8 yd

Points and the Corner Geese)

Right Star Points (6 Fabrics)

Color R1 to R6 3/8 yd, each

Border Geese (3 Fabrics)

 Color BG1
 3/8 yd

 Color BG2
 3/8 yd

 Color BG3
 3/8 yd

Yardage requirements assume fabric is 42" from selvage to selvage. If the fabric is not 42", more may be required.

OPTIONAL FLANGE: The coversheet quilt has a flange on it that is not shown in the line drawings and assembly directions as it is optional. You need an extra 1/4 yard of one of the fabrics in your kit to add the flange.

Border Geese Backgrounds Unique Fabrics Option (6 Fabrics)

If you choose to use different fabrics for your Border Geese Backgrounds, use the following yardage:

Color L1 to L6 3/8 yd, each


(Left Star Points)

Color Bkgd L1 to L5 5/8 yd, each

(Geese Backgrounds)

Color Bkgd L6 (Corners) 3/8 yd
