

A second sample with a more modern design that involved offsetting the quilting by approximately 1/2" around the various seams on each block was used on the Sunsets quilt. This quilt was quilted by Carrie Barone and pictures are available on our Digitized Quilting Designs Pinterest page. A digitized quilting design is not necessary to use this approach for quilting, but an up-close look at the design is provided for you to create on your own. Over time, other designs may become available for this pattern and if so, they will be provided on our website or by scanning the code provided above. Judy prefers a Hobbs 80/20 batting.

## **Backing and Binding Information**

Double Folded Straight Edge Binding: The width of your binding is up to you, Enough yardage is provided in the black sashing fabric to cut the binding strips up to 2-3/4" wide. Reference the cutting diagrams for the sashing fabric on pages 3 and 4 for a general reference of how to cut these strips. It is recommended that you cut the strips at 2-3/4" the entire length of the fabric to minimize the piecing required for the binding. I normally cut my strips 2-3/4" wide. For the binding, the strips are joined together, then pressed in half. The binding is sewn onto the top-side of the quilt with your machine after the batting, backing, and quilting has been completed. It is then hand stitched to the backside of your finished quilt.
